5. NON-ACTION AGENDA

- A. Consideration of Farmers Market Landscaping Plans

The Rotary Club of Parkville has continued its partnership with the City on community beautification efforts, according to Parks and Recreation Director Brittanie Propes. The Rotary Club initially reached out last year to pursue a landscaping project and, in 2025, completed improvements at the roundabout near the A Truss Bridge as well as enhancements to a small area near the entrance of English Landing Park.

Most recently, City staff met with the Rotary Club to discuss a new landscaping project at the Farmers Market site near the new staircase. Brittanie presented a rendering of the proposed project area, which will feature approved native landscaping.

The City has also partnered with Ryan's Lawn & Landscaping, which is completing a portion of the Rotary's landscaping work. Staff requested that Ryan's replicate the Rotary Club's design concept in the remaining area to create a cohesive appearance and improve usability, including a section for picnic tables and an area for limestone block benches. Design concepts are under review.

Proposed improvements include:

- Installation of a concrete patio with picnic tables and umbrellas
- Addition of a sidewalk in front of the parking stalls to connect with the existing sidewalk
- Removal of lower-level rock to be replaced with grass

- Installation of limestone benches

Discussion also included the project budget. Brittanie noted that funding is available within the Farmers Market landscaping budget to support the improvements.

B. Program Sponsorship Packet Review

David Mullen, Parks and Recreation Program Manager, presented an overview of the sponsorship packet that was included in the CLARB packet. The proposed sponsorship partnership is designed to support free programming and family-friendly events in the park. Staff is seeking community partners to help offset a portion of the program costs. This packet will be used as a marketing tool for sponsorship information. The packet is scheduled to be emailed out to Parkville businesses and shared on social media outlets by the end of February. This is a pilot program that could be adjusted in the future based on feedback and overall participation.

CLARB members Evan Maxon and Robert Unger discussed the potential benefits of adding outfield banner sponsorship at the ball fields, noting that it is a common practice at many facilities. Other board members indicated the topic had been discussed previously and expressed that they were not in favor of adding outfield banners. No formal direction was provided by the Board regarding outfield banners. The sponsorship program packet was generally accepted as presented.

C. Review of Grigsby Field Improvement and Maintenance Work

Brittanie Propes, Parks and Recreation Director, provided an update on improvements at Grigsby Field. Enhancements include new benches and the installation of high-impact dugout netting at both dugouts. A pitcher's rubber will be installed on the field; however, teams may use their own equipment if they prefer. Additionally, staff plan to convert the area behind the bleachers into a no-mow zone. The existing rocky section will be removed to reduce maintenance needs and support more sustainable ground management.

Member Linda Arnold left the meeting at 6:55 p.m.

Other Updates:

- The Train Depot tenant, White Farmhouse Flowers, had a soft opening on January 31st and officially opened on February 1st.
- The Pedestrian Bridge is scheduled for delivery this week. Chair Adam Zink asked for temporary barriers to be installed for safety.
- During late winter maintenance at Pocket Park, staff collected seeds to plant elsewhere in the parks.
- 250th Birthday America, park staff planted 250 trees in Platte Landing Park and gave away 250 trees to the community. The city partnered with Missouri Invasive Plant Council and Heartland Tree Alliance for the tree donation.
- MPRA Maintenance Rodeo - Park staff participated in the rodeo with Aaron Shaffner taking 3rd place in the forklift competition.
- Veterans Memorial received additional grant funding that will be used for signage for the memorial.
- Art on the Move Program — the approved art will be installed in the Spring.

C. Parks Programs and Special Events

- Parks Programs and Special Events were included in the CLARB packet and are listed on the city's website.

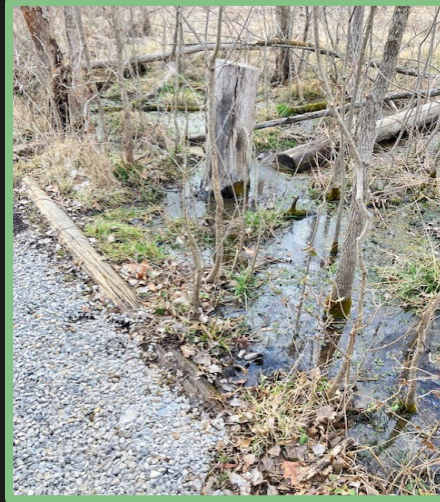

Wooden Telephone Poles

The wooden telephone poles will go on the sides of the trail. They will be pre-cut to length so they fit.



The Gravel and The Trail



The gravel will go on the trail so if it rains the gravel can soak up the water and people can enjoy there walk



Plastic Drain Pipes



We will be putting plastic drain pipes under the trail so water can flow under the trail to prevent erosion.



Tools and Time



The nature center trail is letting me use their supplies for free. This consists of the gravel, pipes, wooden telephone poles and their tools in their shed. We will need a reciprocating saw to cut the pipes. A trained adult will need to operate it.

Summary

February Projects and Accomplishments

The following is a summary of projects and initiatives completed by Parks staff during February that fall outside of routine maintenance and daily operations. These efforts reflect additional work focused on park improvement, habitat restoration, equipment management, and long-term sustainability initiatives.

Park Improvements and Maintenance

Pocket Park Improvements

- **February 3** – Trimmed back vegetation, removed debris, cleaned the area, and refreshed mulch at Pocket Park.
- **February 4** – Completed mulching project at Pocket Park.

Dog Park Improvements

- **February 4** – Seeded and applied straw to muddy areas in the Large Dog Park to improve ground conditions and usability.

Martin Bird Habitat Maintenance

- **February 11** – Cleaned and re-hung Martin bird houses to maintain habitat for returning migratory birds.

Natural Resource Management and Habitat Restoration

Invasive Species Removal

- **February 5** – Conducted invasive species removal along Brush Creek.
- **February 11** – Continued invasive species removal efforts at East End of English Landing Park, Riverfront Trail

Creek Bank Restoration (A-Truss Bridge Area)

- **February 18** – Conducted a controlled burn along the A-Truss Creek bank to support native habitat restoration.
- **February 19** – Seeded the A-Truss Creek area with native grasses including **Indiangrass and Switchgrass** to stabilize the bank and promote native vegetation.

Wetland Wildlife Management

- **February 23 – February 27** – Conducted muskrat trapping in the PLP Wetlands, with traps monitored and checked daily to manage wildlife impacts on the wetland ecosystem.

Native Planting Initiatives

Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) Seedlings Program

- **February 19** – Received MDC seedlings and began planting preparation.
- **February 20** – Planted MDC seedlings at North Sullivan Trail in Sullivan Nature Sanctuary.
- **February 23** – Continued preparation for additional MDC seedling planting efforts.

Equipment Maintenance and Operational Efficiency

Scheduled Equipment Maintenance

- **February 12** – Performed scheduled equipment maintenance, including fluid checks and oil changes.
- **February 13** – Continued scheduled equipment maintenance, including fluid checks and oil changes.

In-House Equipment Fabrication

- **February 17** – Assembled a new watering/controlled burn rig, built in-house at approximately one-third of the cost of the original quoted price, providing significant cost savings for the department.

Professional Development

Plan It Native Conference

- **February 10–11** – Staff members Travis Phelan and Wayne Frazier attended the **Plan It Native Conference**, gaining education and training related to native plantings, ecological restoration, and sustainable land management practices.
- **February 24-27**: Travis Phelan attended the Missouri Parks and Recreation Association conference

Farmers Market

Full Project History in previous packets

January 28, 2026, Parks Staff met with Ryan's Lawn & Landscape to review their proposed landscape design for the area south of the Farmers Market structure and west of the handicap ramp. Parks Staff marked up Ryan's document with questions and comments and are currently waiting to hear back.

The Jack Friedman commemorative plaque was installed on the west face of the SW column on February 6, 2026.

Parks Staff will be ordering 5-6 replacement timber wheel stops from the contractor.

Parks Staff is looking for a fix to hold down the bollard receiver covers at the entrances to the north and south parking lots. The contractor has ordered a rubber gasket to test fit one of the covers. It should be in place within the next two weeks.

Ryan's Lawn & Landscape provided landscape cost estimates for the areas north, south and west of the Farmers Market structure.

STATUS – IN PROGRESS

Gateway Park (9 HWY and NW 62nd Street)

To comply with the City's Sign Ordinance, Park Staff is soliciting bids for a new stone monument base and perimeter landscaping to incorporate with the existing park identification sign. The location will remain the same.

By the Blade was awarded the bid for the new monument sign. They will begin construction in March 2026.

STATUS – IN PROGRESS

New Pedestrian Bridge and Vehicular Bridge Improvements at So. Main Street and Rush Creek

The scope of this project is to remove the existing concrete traffic/pedestrian separation barrier, thus allowing for two-way traffic, and build a separate pedestrian foot-bridge to be located immediately to the east.

Staff is applying for an Outreach Grant from Platte County for this work. Submission deadline is January 19, 2024. Staff is also looking into other bridge improvement grant funding sources.

Staff has reached out to one of our On-Call structural engineers, Garver, to provide us with an assessment of the existing bridge. This assessment will include current condition, determining maximum allowable loads, and costs of the improvements.

Staff has submitted a grant application request in the amount of \$40,000, and will present our application in-person to Platte County on February 27, 2024.

Grant decision still pending.

Platte County has awarded the City its full grant request of \$40,000.

Staff is currently writing up a Request for Qualifications for engineering design work. It is anticipated that this RFQ will be issued by May 10th, 2024

Staff is in contact with on-call consultants to finalize the design scope of work

McClure Engineering has been contracted to design the vehicular and pedestrian bridge

Soil borings have been taken and are currently being analyzed by Kaw Valley Engineering for the foundations of the future pedestrian bridge

McClure is currently putting together a design schedule. It is anticipated that this project will go out to bid after the first of the year

Staff is working with McClure to determine exact location of the pedestrian bridge based on connectivity of the existing trails. Design work is continuing.

Staff is meeting with McClure on Monday, January 6, 2025 to review 90% complete construction documents.

It is anticipated that the project will go out to bid in mid-January 2025.

Staff is currently reviewing the final construction documents. It is anticipated that this project will go out to bid on the week of 2/24/25.

It is anticipated that this project will go out to bid the week of April 6, 2025.

Bids were received on May 28, 2025. Linaweaver Construction was the low bidder and awarded the project. We are currently finalizing their contract.

It is estimated that the project will be completed around the end of 2025.

Linaweaver Construction has been issued a Notice to Proceed with the project.

Shop drawings have been issued and reviewed by the Project Engineer and City Staff.

Fabrication of the new pedestrian bridge should begin this month. It is anticipated that it will arrive on site by the end of November.

The contractor has mobilized on-site and begun excavation for the two pedestrian bridge foundations. Pile driving will begin on Thursday, January 15, 2026.

Construction of the pedestrian bridge is scheduled to be completed by February 13, 2026. Modifications to the existing vehicular bridge will begin immediately after. That vehicular bridge work is anticipated to take approximately 2 weeks. The bridge will remain in service during construction.

February 6, 2026 - The two concrete embankments have been poured and are currently curing.

The pedestrian bridge is scheduled to be delivered on February 19, 2026, with project completion scheduled for March 9, 2026.

The City has hired McClure Engineering to do a structural assessment of the existing vehicular bridge to determine the maximum structural load capacity. Assessment results are expected from the engineer by the end of this week. This will then be posted on a permanent sign at the north entrance to the bridge.

The bridge was delivered and set in place on February 19, 2026. The concrete trail approaches to either end of the bridge were poured on March 5, 2026. The project is estimated to be completed by March 11, 2016.

STATUS – IN PROGRESS

Girl Scout Shelter

Park Staff will be soliciting bids for flashing installation between the existing chimney and roof.

STATUS – IN PROGRESS

Veterans Memorial (Phase 2)

City Staff is working with the Veteran's Committee on planning out future phase work.

(2) kiosks and (3) military branch monuments have been ordered from Johnson Granite Supply. It is anticipated that fabrication and installation will take 3-4 months.

The Veteran's Committee has received a \$15,000 grant from the Downtown CID. This grant will be used for a monument sign to be located along the north side of the site. City Staff is assisting the Veteran's Committee with soliciting bids for this work.

Staff is waiting on wording for the final Veterans Memorial bench plaque. Bench and plaque will be order under approval from the Veterans Committee.

New replaced flags have been ordered since the existing flags look worn and tattered.

STATUS – IN PROGRESS

Platte Landing Park Inclusive Playground

This project is a new inclusive playground identified in the 2025 Parks and Recreation Master Plan. The playground will be located at the site of the existing soccer practice fields (Friends Field), across S. Main Street from Friends' Shelter.

On January 9, 2026, City staff hosted a Community Engagement Meeting at the YMCA to gather additional community input for the playground concept. The presentation was led by Brent Magruder of Kompan, the playground designer and builder, along with Brittanie Propes. Community feedback was largely positive. Participants emphasized the importance of including ADA-accessible parking, a shade structure, trees to serve as a buffer, a water fountain, picnic seating, and historical signage, with the Steamboat Arabia cited as an example. Additional suggestions included considering a larger playground footprint and amenities designed for children with visual impairments. One resident raised concerns regarding the size of the parking lot and the use of concrete. The concrete parking lot was selected to meet ADA accessibility requirements.

Park Staff is waiting for the 2026 Platte County Partnership Grant program to open, to submit application for the cost of the playground structure and equipment. The City is proposing to pay for the cost of the design and construction of an adjoining parking lot and overall site improvements. Design will include budgetary costs so the project can be put out to bid.

STATUS – IN PROGRESS

Trail Improvements from Downtown to New Platte Landing Park Inclusive Playground

On January 16, 2026, Parks Staff applied for an \$80,000 Platte County Outreach Grant to replace and extend a concrete trail from the entrance of English Landing Park to the new proposed inclusive playground in Platte Landing Park. Grant award announcements are expected to be made sometime this month.

STATUS – IN PROGRESS

English Landing Entrance Gates

Parks Staff is currently studying entrance gate design options at the McAfee Street entrance to English Landing Park.

Parks Staff is currently seeking quotes from (3) local vendors.
